Rev. Thomas Eyre, chancellor of Wells Cathedral ∞ Miss Edgell

⇒ Rev. Thomas Eyre (1731–1812), LLD, rector of Fovant and Chilmark in Wiltshire, treasurer of Wells Cathedral and canon residentiary of Wells and Salisbury {*Downman*}

⇒ Frances (1740–1815) {*Downman*} ∞ 1° Major Robert Sherwood (1739–1774) {*Downman*}; 2° her first cousin Harry Edgell (1731–1801)

⇒ three other children

Venn Eyre (1712–1777), Prebend of St Asaph 1754; Rector of Salkeld, Cumberland and Archdeacon of Carlisle 1756–77, pastellist; brother-in-law of Edmund Keene, Bishop of Ely and of Sir Benjamin Keene

Mary Eyre (1726–1785) {*Gardner*} ∞ Anthony Cooke {*Gardner*}

Francis Eyre of Warkworth (–1804) ∞ 1755 Lady Mary Radcliffe (1732–1798) {*Cotes*}, dau. of Charles Radcliffe, “Earl of Derwentwater”

Mary Letitia Eyre (1784–1860) {*Russell*} ∞ 1° Charles Herbert Pierrepont; 2° Charles Herbert Pierrepont, 2nd Earl Manvers (1778–1860) {*Russell*}

Colonel Thomas Eyre (c.1720–1772), of the 49th Foot {*Irish sch.*} ∞ Anne Cook {*Irish sch.*}

Henry Eyre of Rowter, sheriff of Derbyshire

⇒ Anne Eyre (1716–1805) ∞ 1741 Clotworthy Skeffington, 1st Earl of Massereene (c.1715–1757)

⇒ Lady Elizabeth Skeffington (–1817) ∞ Robert Clements, 1st Earl of Leitrim 1795 (1732–1804) {*Batoni; Hoare; G Stuart? q.v.*}

⇒ Clotworthy Skeffington, 2nd Earl of Massereene (1743–1805)
