HAY OF KINNOULL

George Henry Hay, Viscount Dupplin, 8th Earl of Kinnoull [Kinnoull; Kinoull] (1689–1758), British ambassador to the Porte 1729–34 ∞ Lady Abigail Harley, dau. of Earl of Oxford, sister of Duchess of Leeds
