William Higginson (–1708), captain of dragoons, killed at siege of Lille ∞ N Hunt

⇒ William Higginson, of Rich's dragoons

⇒ John Higginson (1704–1770), citizen of London, owned timber wharf on the Thames and land in Marlow and Essex ∞ Elizabeth Coke (1715–1783), dau. of Richard Coke of Melcombe Regis

⇒⇒ Mary ∞ 1768 Thomas Langley of Marlow

⇒⇒⇒ Rev. Thomas Langley (–1801sp)

⇒⇒ Alexander Higginson (1746–1793), chief of the provincial council at Burdwan, member of the Board of Trade {*Smart*} ∞ Calcutta 1779 Martha Isaacs (–1840), pastellist {*Russell*}

⇒⇒⇒ Colonel Alexander Higginson (1782–1855sa), of Christ Church, Oxford; ensign 1804, major of the Grenadier Guards

⇒⇒⇒ Charles Harwood Higginson (1784–1824), judge in the Supreme Court of Calcutta ∞ N (–1822)

⇒⇒⇒ George Powell Higginson (1788–1866), ensign 1805, general, Grenadier Guards {*Russell*} ∞ 1825 Lady Frances Elizabeth Needham, dau. of 1st Earl of Kilmorey

⇒⇒⇒⇒ General Sir George Wentworth Higginson (1826–1927)

⇒⇒⇒ Rev. Henry Higginson (1790–1848) ∞ 1826 Harriet Casamajor (1793–1869), dau. of James Henry Casamajor *q.v.*

⇒⇒⇒ Martha Elizabeth (1791–) ∞ 1815 Major-General Archibald Campbell (1774–1838), of the 6th Foot, son of Sir James Campbell, 9th of Tearlach of Inverneil

⇒⇒⇒ Louisa Maria (1793–1843)
