Sir Ambrose Phillips (–1706), King's Serjeant 1686

⇒⇒ Samuel Phillips (–1775) of Garendon 1° ∞ 1° Septima Lewis; 2° Mary Alsop (–1796) [∞ 2° 1776 Sir William Gordon]

⇒ Mary ∞ Edward Lisle of Crux Easton And Moyle's Court

⇒⇒ Jane Lisle ∞ Thomas March of London

⇒⇒⇒ Thomas March-Phillips 1796, né March (1747–1817), inherited Garendon Park in 1796 ∞ his cousin Susan Lisle (–p.1817)

⇒⇒⇒ Charles March Phillips (1779–1862)

⇒⇒⇒⇒ Ambrose Charles Lisle March Phillips De Lisle (1809–1878)

⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒ Ambrose Charles Lisle March Phillips De Lisle (–1883)

⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒ Everard March Philipps de Lisle (–1885)

⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒ Everard March-Phillipps-de Lisle (–1947)

⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒⇒ Ambrose Paul Jordan March-Phillipps-de Lisle (–1963), when Garendon demolished

James Philipps (1710–1794) of Penty Park

⇒ James Philipps (1710–1794) of Penty Park, high sheriff of Pembrokeshire {*Hoare*} ∞ 1733 Jane Pryse or Pryce (–1762) {*Hoare*}, dau. of Lewis Pryce of Gogerdan, 2 sisters {*Hoare*}

⇒⇒ Mary (1737–1815) ∞ Sir Richard Philipps, 7th Bt, of Picton Castle, Lord Milford (1744–1823sp)
