Larion Gavrilovich Vorontsov [Воронцов] (1674–1750)

⇒ Comte Mikhail Larionovich Vorontsov (1714–1767), chev. Saint-André, vice-chancellor 1744–58, grand chancellor 1758–63 {*Toqué; Éc. fr. Other schools*} ∞ Anna Skavronskaia (1722–1775) {*Toqué*}, nièce de Catherine I^{re}

⇒ Anna Mikhailovna (1743–1769) {*Toqué*} ∞ 1758 Baron Alexander Stroganov (1733–1811), senator, president of the Academy of Arts

⇒ Roman Larionovich Vorontsov (1717–1783) ∞ Maria Ivanovna Surmina (1718–1745)

⇒ Comte Alexander Romanovich Vorontsov (1741–1805), ministre à Londres, puis à La Haye 1762–68, président au collège de Commerce [JH Schmidt](#)}

⇒ Comte Semyon Romanovich Vorontsov (1744–1832), ambassadeur à Vienne 1783, Londres 1785 {*Lawrence; Voille*} ∞ Ekaterina Alexeievna Seniavina (–1784) {*Levitsky*}

⇒ Mikhail Semenovich Vorontsov (1782–1856) ∞ Elizaveta Ksaver'evna Branitskaia

⇒ Ekaterina Semenovna (1783–1856) 2^o ∞ 1808 George Augustus Herbert, 11th Earl of Pembroke (1759–1827) {*Batoni; Gardner; Greuz; Reynolds*} [∞ 1^o 1787 Elizabeth Beauclerk (1766–1793) {*Beauclerk*}] *q.v.*

⇒ Ekaterina Romanovna Vorontsova (1743–1810), director of the Imperial Academy of Sciences 1783, founder and president of the Russian Academy 1783 {*Levitsky*} ∞ N. Dashkov
